Competition Requirements

This show will be conducted and judged in accordance with the United States Rules for Working Equitation, Revision 6,, dated 1 January 2023. The rules can be found at the following site: <https://usawe.org/rules>. It is the competitor's responsibility to read and understand the rules prior to the competition.

NOTE: THERE ARE NEW DRESSAGE TESTS FOR 2023.

All competitors holding a membership with USAWE may compete. Non-members are allowed to compete in for a \$20 non-member fee. Non-members can use a one-time voucher in place of the non-member fee.

Competitors interested in being eligible for lifetime medal awards and year-end awards must be USAWE members.

All competing horses must be recorded with USAWE in advance of the show. A one-time fee of \$20 per horse includes lifetime performance tracking.

A single horse and rider team is allowed to show in only one level. A horse may be entered twice in a competition if ridden by two different riders and in different levels. Exception: Two youth can share the same horse if competing in Level 1. See Rulebook, Section 1.7.

Riders must be correctly attired and horses properly presented in accordance with the U.S. Rules for Working Equitation. Show Management may, at its discretion, bar any person or horse from entering the arena if not suitably presented.

Entry Procedures

- A separate entry form must be completed for each horse-rider combination.
- **INVOICES:** Invoices will be sent out via Paypal **ON THE CLOSING DATE, February 11** and will need to be paid within 24 hrs
- **ONLINE ENTRY FORM** can be found on our website ecfwe.com once the entries have opened January 14, 2023
- Entries after the closing date will be assessed a late fee.
- Youth exhibitors must be 17 or under at any time during the current year. Youth exhibitors must indicate their date of birth on the entry form.

Payment Policy

Entries will be through an online google form. You will receive a copy of your completed form and that will be your entry confirmation. If you have received a copy of the form, then we have as well. INVOICES: Invoices will be sent out via Paypal ON THE CLOSING DATE, February 11 and will need to be paid within 24 hrs.

Prizes/Awards

Classes will be placed and ribbons awarded by Level only. However, points will be reported to USAWE split by rider division (Open, Amateur, Youth) and level (Intro- Masters).

- Ribbons will be awarded for 1st -6th for each individual phase
- Ribbons will be awarded for 1st-6th place for overall placings.
- Prizes will be awarded for 1st-3rd overall placings
- High point awards will be given for each division. (High point = Dressage & EOH average %)

Stabling Details

- **12X12** temporary stalls will be available on a first come first serve basis (no tack or groom stalls).
- A limited number of 12x12 outdoor corrals will also be available.
- Shavings will be available for purchase at \$15/bag. No Feed will be available for purchase.

Rules and Regulations

Hold Harmless Clause: Understanding that horse sports may be hazardous and dangerous, even leading to permanent injury or death, each owner, rider, spectator, and other participant assumes any and all risk of loss or injury and agrees to hold harmless, regardless, the horse show personnel and the facility hosting the show. El Campeon Farms will not be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, or grooms. All facility rules must be followed.

Media Release Agreement: I agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, or other likenesses of me and/or my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion or benefit of the competition or sport. These likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in any way to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or misappropriation.

Dog Policy: Please leave your dogs at home. If you need to bring your dog(s), please have them leashed at all times. We prefer that dogs remain in the stabling area for the safety of the competitors and spectators.

Farm Access: Gates will be open from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm, Friday and 6:00 am to 6:00 pm Saturday and Sunday. **ABSOLUTELY NO after hours arrivals are allowed unless you have made prior arrangements with the show manager, Christy Reich (310) 729-5105.**

EL CAMPEON FARMS EHV- 1 POLICY & PROTOCOLS FOR ECF HORSE SHOWS

While there has not been a recent EHV-1 outbreak in California, this virus tends to appear in the early to late Spring. Accordingly, we will be implementing the suggested USEF biosecurity protocols for all entrants in order to maintain the highest level of safety for all the horses on ECF premises.

As with any situation that involves our horses' welfare, we are all relying on the honesty of the individuals that are responsible for the horses' care. The documents that will be required for ECF show participants will be considered truthful and binding. In the event of any of these protocols being disregarded we will refuse further entries from all related horses.

1) Healthy Horse Policy: Entry to ECF shows is limited to healthy horses only. We will prohibit entry of horses displaying obvious clinical signs of disease, such as copious nasal discharge, persistent frequent coughing or neurologic signs, such as ataxia or marked hind limb weakness (wobbly gait).

2) Two Week No Fever Policy: Owners/agents must provide documentation upon arrival that shows that their horse has not had a fever above 102 degrees for the two week period prior to the show start date. Entrants will be required to provide ECF show officials a completed 2 week, [daily temp check](#) chart before being able to compete.

3) Healthy Horse Declaration: Upon arrival, we will require that the owner/agent sign a health certification statement attesting that the listed horse(s) arriving at ECF have been healthy with no clinical signs of a contagious disease or body temperature(s) above 102°F for the preceding seven (7) days.

PREVENTION PROTOCOLS

- Avoid animal-to-animal contact
- Do not share equipment between horses. IF YOU MUST SHARE, scrub and clean equipment with detergent and dry completely between shared use.
- When filling water buckets, **DO NOT dip the end of the hose in each bucket. Hold the hose above the water when filling.**
- Wash/sanitize hands thoroughly before and after direct horse contact
- Limit human-horse contact
- Check and record temperatures twice daily (Daily temp charts will be available on the front of each stall. Temperatures must be checked and recorded in the morning and evening.)
- Any suspicion of illness in horses, including a temperature over 101.5°F, should be immediately reported to the show office and veterinarian.
- Immediately isolate and/or quarantine any horse exhibiting symptoms of illness
- DO NOT travel to another competition for 14 days
- Because humans can be a means of disease transmission, avoid moving between barns unless absolutely necessary
